

Pronunciation like the highlighted vowels in Dennis, berry, merry, jerry

Its usage is same as in Hindi (पैरी, तैथिक, बैठक) and occasionally in English (aerate, paella) It however has limited use in Kashmiri as many times it is replaced by य y when not the first letter of a word

## Using औ ौ au:

Its usage is same as in Hindi (गौरव, दौड) and sometimes in English (aura, fauna) too. It however has limited use in Kashmiri as most

of the times it is replaced by 31 au when first letter of the word and  $\sqrt{4}$  when not first letter of a word

### Conjuncts with य ê:

Conjuncts are letters joined together. Their usage is same as in Hindi. In Kashmiri, we have to be very cautious about the pronunciation because sound of  $\hat{\mathbf{e}}$  –य is sometimes confused with  $\hat{\mathbf{e}}$  (Consider the minute difference in saying berry and bend)

In Kashmiri, we have to be very cautious about the pronunciation because sound of -ব ô is sometimes confused with ó औ (Consider the minute difference in Kashmiri words khó» and khô»h)
